Prabodhini Fellowship

1. Introduction

- 1.1. In 2020, RMP's Indian Institute of Democratic Leadership (IIDL) and Manipal Education and Medical Group (MEMG), launched the Udaan Fellowship Programme.
- 1.2. This fellowship provides fellows with distinctive opportunities to gain practical experience in the socio-political arena through extensive engagement with leaders, think tanks, and voluntary organizations.
- 1.3. Moving forward, this fellowship will be known as the 'Prabodhini Fellowship'.

2. Objectives of the Programme

- 2.1. The main objective of this Programme is to inculcate the discipline of research in the youth of Bharat. It underscores the importance of academic endeavour in any field of social-political activity.
- 2.2. The Programme is designed to provide hands-on work experience in leadership, management, politics, governance, democracy, and public policy domains, making it a practical learning experience.
- 2.3. It aims to enable fellows to participate actively in socio-political developments.
- 2.4. The Programme also aims to hone the fellows' soft skills, such as effective communication, writing, public speaking, etc., which will equip them to take on new challenges.
- 2.5. Additionally, the Programme aims to introduce the fellows to alternative career options in the socio-political sphere.

3. Eligibility

- 3.1. The applicant must be between 23 and 35 years of age.
- 3.2. The applicant must hold a Post-Graduate Degree with a minimum of 50% marks.

- 3.3. Applicants with a minimum of one year of experience in the socio-academic or political landscape will be preferred.
- 3.4. The applicant must demonstrate a keen interest in societal and political issues, with a desire to contribute to society.
- 3.5. The applicant should possess strong communication skills, both oral and written.

4. Mode of Selection

- 4.1. Applications for the fellowship will be invited annually in the month of July.
- 4.2. All received applications will undergo preliminary screening.
- 4.3. Shortlisted candidates will be invited for an interview.
- 4.4. The selection will be based on the performance during the interview.

5. Terms of the Fellowship Programme

- 5.1. The Fellowship will have a duration of 6 to 12 months, starting in August and concluding either in January or July of the following year, depending on the evaluation of the proposed research work.
- 5.2. Each year, 35 Fellowships will be awarded across three domain categories: Political, Socio-economic, and Policy/Governance, focusing on the most relevant and contemporary issues.
- 5.3. Fellows may choose any topic related to anyone of the three domains based on their area of interest.
- 5.4. The stipend for Fellows will be Rs. 22,000 per month.
- 5.5. The Fellowship may be discontinued if the Monthly Reports are not submitted or an objective assessment indicates the need for disciplinary action.
- 5.6. Selected Fellows must commit in writing that they will not undertake any other paid work during the Fellowship's duration.

6. Mode of work

- 6.1. Within each domain category (Political, Socio-economic, and Policy/Governance), candidates are required to select a Mentor.
- 6.2. If a fellow is unable to identify a Mentor, RMP- IIDL will assign one to guide them on a subject.
- 6.3. Fellows may choose to work autonomously as researchers or collaborate with relevant socio-political organizations.

7. Mentorship

7.1. Mentors will be in regular contact with the Fellows and provide guidance as needed.

- 7.2. Mentors will support Fellows in developing skills related to research, teamwork, and related activities and processes.
- 7.3. Mentors will be invited to participate in the boot camp and convocation ceremony.

8. Monitoring

- 8.1. RMP-IIDL and Mentors jointly oversee the progress of the Fellows' work.
- 8.2. RMP-IIDL will organize monthly meetings (Online/Physical) for regular reporting and feedback.
- 8.3. Mentors will decide on the frequency and method of monitoring the Fellows' work.

9. Report Submission

- 9.1. Fellows must submit their study report within the specified timeframe.
- 9.2. RMP-IIDL will decide the mode of evaluation for the reports.
- 9.3. The revised version of the report, incorporating inputs from mentors and RMP-IIDL, must be submitted before the conclusion of the Fellowship Programme.
- 9.4. A certificate of completion will be awarded to Fellows who successfully meet the Programme requirements.

10. Publication and IPR

- **10.1.** Fellows are encouraged to publish articles in print or digital media related to their area of work or research topic, acknowledging their affiliation as Prabodhini Fellows.
- 10.2. RMP-IIDL retains intellectual property rights over the final report submitted.
